Update: Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Josh Thomson reported there has been a total of \$3,151 spent so far with a little over \$1,000 of that spent in January for advertising.

Update: Secretary Report

Secretary Brent Timm reported a Selection Committee was formed to review the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) submitted regarding the Human Services Transportation Plan (HSTP), which was up for action on tonight's Agenda. In addition, the RFQ's for the OCOG/RTPO Administrative Support position closed on February 8, 2022. Okanogan County Engineer/Treasurer Josh Thomson reported he had not received any RFQ applications for that position.

Update: Okanogan County Report

Okanogan County Engineer/Treasurer Josh Thomson reported on the following:

- A State Transportation Funding Package is available and there are a few concerns at the local
 city/county levels as currently all the revenue is going directly to the State. Typically, a work group
 had been in place to decide where the money should go, but that hasn't happened; therefore, they
 have suggested to not skip that step.
- The Surface Transportation Program (STP) allocation has increased by 10% which is a little over an additional \$100,000.
- The local road projects are pretty quiet, but soon they will start working on a bridge project.

Commissioner/Vice Chairman Chris Branch reported on the following:

- The County's previous Prosecuting Attorney (PA) resigned, so they have contracted with an outside PA from Wahkiakum County until the end of year, at which time there will be an election.
- They are still discussing ARPA funds in detail and how to spend that money. The County does have its own projects they want to implement on their own and there has also been some requests from Social Service programs. There was approximately 8.2 million dollars awarded and they have been working with the Economic Alliance which can help businesses affected by Covid 19.

• They finished their comprehensive plan which hasn't been challenged yet but could be. He stated some land use codes will change in the near future with water being an emphasis.

Update: Washington State Department of Transportation

WSDOT representative Maxwell Nelson reported on the following:

- They are still waiting on outputs for the State budget process which will have an impact on some
 of the work done by OCOG, but it is still in a holding pattern.
- This month a team will do a site-inspection of the Oroville Bridge due to an uneven bridge deck. They hope to have a contract in place this Spring to repair it.

WSDOT Regional Liaison Kate Tollefson reported on the following:

WSDOT Public Transportation has an open Regional Mobility Grant for the 2023-2025 biennium.
 Eligible applicants are cities and counties as well as ports and public transit agencies. A concept, which is a statement of interest, is due to WSDOT by March 03, 2022, and the main grant application will be due this Spring. County-Wide Emergency Updates/Discussion

Maurice Goodall, Okanogan County Emergency Management Director reported on the following:

- Covid-19 testing has moved from the Okanogan County Fairgrounds to the Okanogan Legion Park.
 Future testing dates will be on February 25, 2022, March 11, 2022, and March 25, 2022, from 11am to 1pm.
- On the Emergency Management side of things, it has been pretty quiet. They are looking at some emergency evacuation routes in the Methow Valley.

Action/Discussion: Consultant Selection for Human Services Transportation Plan (HSTP)

Secretary Brent Timm reported OCOG received 3 proposals from Consultants which were Via Mobility, SCJ Alliance, and David Evans & Associates. A Selection Committee was formed, they met and scored SCJ Alliance at the top. Okanogan County Engineer/Treasurer Josh Thomson reported both Via Mobility and SCJ Alliance have a local consultant, Ara Swanson, out of the Methow area who handles the public
