#### Call to Order

#### **Update: Treasurer's Report**

### **Update: Secretary Report**

Chairperson Ing-Moody welcomed Brent Timm to OCOG in his capacity as Acting General Manager for OCTA/TranGO.

#### **Update: Okanogan County Report**

Commissioner/Vice Chaiperson Branch reported on the following:

- The Okanogan County Fairgrounds well went dry
- He mentioned that the Okanogan Court had been using the Agri-Plex building for court trials because of the Covid distancing requirements. He shared that the County has been discussing the purchase of the former Forest Service building next to the public works building.

### **Update: Washington State Department of Transportation**

WSDOT Representative reported on the following:

- Kate Tollefson reported that someone on the OCOG Board would need to sign up for their Grant Management System to manage the grant; Treasurer Thomson will sign up.
- Gabe Phillips stated that he was present to listen and answer any questions
- George Mazur reported that their 2022-2023 preservation project will begin soon.
- Because of the vaccine mandate, WSDOT offices will be short staffed beginning 10/18/21
- There is a plan to fix the track near Oroville beginning 09/27/21

#### **Update: Back Roads Study**

Treasurer Thomson reported that there is nothing new regarding the Back Roads Study at this time, but Hans Shepherd of SCJ is still available for questions.

### County-Wide Emergency Updates/Discussion

Maurice Goodall, Okanogan County Dept of Emergency Management Director reported on the following:

- He updated the group on the status of the fire situations. The crews are mostly in mop up mode. Some crews were hit with Covid and quarantined during fire season
- Covid is still prevalent, he urged everyone to take precautions.
- Vaccines are still being given at the Fairgrounds on Fridays, between 8 10 a.m.; no preregistering needed
- PPE supplies are still available through the Emergency Management office

Tony Hawley, Okanogan County Sheriff, reported on the following:

- All entities both in and out of the county worked well together on the fires and emergency management issues
- There is a large focus on the new legislation effecting Law Enforcement. He encouraged everyone to call in and let dispatch make the decision about what they may or may not be able to do in a situation
- They are working with Okanogan County Behaviorial Health on "people in crisis" issues
